

<p>Personal Social and Emotional Development</p> <p>New starters settling in, learning about our routines and exploring the setting, returning for adult support when needed.</p> <p>Share a book with an adult 1:1 and in very small groups</p> <p>Listen to a story in a small group and respond to questions about the story</p>	<p>Communication and Language</p> <p>Focus language: owl, feather, twit twoo, fox swooped, silently, trunk, twigs, leaves, ivy, woods, mice, flapped</p> <p>Café and shop role play</p> <p>Encourage the children to use language to pretend and talk to their friends and teachers as they play</p>	<p>Physical Development</p> <p>Little Starz Session on a Thursday-practising big movements like jumping, running, hopping, crawling, balancing, catching, throwing, kicking</p> <p>Pencil control-</p> <p>Use crayons, paintbrushes and fingers to make marks on owl pictures and use pencils to join the dots carefully to draw an owl</p> <p>Use scissors to cut out owl pictures to make stick puppets to act out the story</p>	<p>Literacy</p> <p>Focus stories: Owl Babies, That's not my Owl</p> <p>Listen to stories in small and large groups</p> <p>What are the names of the 3 owls?</p> <p>Where do you think mummy owl has gone?</p> <p>Encourage all the children to explore the book corner and choose stories to look at.</p>

Where are the owls eyes and beak?</p> <p>Decorate an owl template with feathers using a glue stick to make it sticky. Can you get the glue right to the edges?
