<p>To enjoy sharing a book with an adult</p> <p>To pay attention to a story and respond to the pictures or words</p> <p>To be able to repeat words and phrases from this familiar story</p> <p>Learn new vocabulary</p>	<p>Read lift the flap and noisy animal stories to the children 1:1 and in very small groups throughout the week</p> <p>Share the story 'Handa's Surprise'</p>	<p>Where is the zebra?</p> <p>Which fruit is yellow?</p> <p>What is the girl doing?</p> <p>Focus vocabulary- banana, orange, pineapple, zebra, monkey, goat, giraffe, elephant</p>
<p>To recognise and name some familiar fruits- banana, pineapple, orange, tangerine</p> <p>To recognise and name some familiar animals- giraffe, elephant, zebra, monkey, goat</p>	<p>Share the story Handa's Surprise and point out and name the different fruits and animals. Ask questions of the children- which animal ate the banana...etc.</p> <p>Share picture cards from the story and ask the children to match the fruit to the animal who ate it from a choice of 4.</p> <p>Colour in different fruits using appropriate colours using real fruit as a prompt.</p>	<p>Vocabulary from the story plus lots of fruit names and colours</p>
	<p>Use oranges to print with- painting them orange and seeing the patterns they make as we print with them</p>	

<p>To recognise and name a dragon To develop their fine motor and early writing skills</p> <p>To try new food items</p>	<p>Share pictures of dragons and explore stories about them. Finger paint the dots on a dragon's head picture, talking about colour and only using one finger to paint with!</p> <p>Visit from the fruit lady from Tesco's who will bring in lot of different fruits for the children to feel and taste Tasting Chinese foods- noodles, prawn crackers</p>	<p>China, dragon</p> <p>Fruit names- juicy/tasty Noodles, prawn crackers</p>
<p>To listen and respond to a familiar story To repeat phrases from the story To ask questions about the story, make comments and share their own ideas. To understand the sequence of a familiar story. To explore non-fiction books To learn new vocabulary</p>	<p>Read the story 'Handa's Surprise' Ask questions and encourage the children to share ideas about the story</p> <p>Use picture cards from the story of real fruits and animals. Can the children match the animal to the fruit it ate? Can the children sequence the story in the correct order using the cards?</p>	<p>Language of the story- fruits- guava, banana, orange, mango, pineapple, tangerine, passion fruit Animals- antelope, zebra, goat, monkey, giraffe, elephant</p>
		

<p>To recognise and name so more unusual fruits and animals</p>	<p>Share the story Handa's Surprise and ask questions about the fruit and animals in it. Play fruit bingo- can you name and match the fruit? Explore real fruit and colour in or paint a picture of them using the correct colours</p>	<p>More unusual fruit names</p>
<p>To recognise and name and learn about a mythical creature- a dragon</p>	<p>Share pictures and stories about dragons including the Zog stories. What does Zog need to learn to do as a dragon?</p>	<p>Dragon - breathing fire, flying high</p>
<p>To find about another country and some of its traditions- Africa and China</p>	<p>Find China and Africa on our world map Share non-fiction books about them Watch videos of dragon dancing on kids YouTube Handa's Surprise- how is an African village different to Macclesfield?</p>	<p>China, Africa Chinese foods and traditions African houses and clothes</p>
